



- Over 1600 marks were issued to Standard to provide to kids who show up to buses without one. The buses are considered an extension of the school in regards to masking. (if family refuses to mask their child, a disposable will be provided by the bus driver. If it is refused, than an incident report be submitted to the school and dispatch at Standard. A discipline such as a bus suspension or bus expulsion will come from the school level.
- A variety of electronic registration is being worked on and hopefully be ready for next school year to be used by parents
- In Jan. 2020 there were approx. 2000 registered riders; this year approx. 1900 seats have been assigned; approx. 500 outstanding registrations still waiting for bus seats; approx. 25% of students were not properly registered in the system last year. e.g. Superintendents are now keeping a list of students that why are attending school outside of their catchment area and the reason as:
  - The City of Whitehorse has ongoing projects in school zone areas, such as: signage, expanding school zone areas, cross walks, improving sightlines
  - In February there should be a city wide study made of school zone signage and associations are encouraged to consider the issues they face as turnaround time on these consultations may be short
  - Data trackers have been installed at select schools to determine speed, the number of cars passing through zones, etc.
